Let's Practice! Complex Sentences

Complex sentences are made out of **dependant** and **independent clauses**. You can tell when there is going to be a dependant clause when it begins with an **AWUBIS** conjunction, also called a **subordinating conjunction**. Dependant clauses can be at the beginning or in the middle of a sentence, so be careful!

Here are some examples:

When he handed in his homework, he forgot to give the teacher the last page. The students went to the movies **after** they finished studying. **Because** the students were so great, the teacher didn't give them any homework!
